Gail A. Bishop received the Ph.D. degree in Cellular and Molecular Biology from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, MI. This was followed by postdoctoral work at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, NC, She was appointed Assistant Professor of Microbiology at the University of Iowa in 1989, was promoted to Associate Professor with tenure in 1994, and to Professor in 1998. She was appointed as endowed College of Medicine Distinguished Professor of Microbiology in 2001, and Holden Chair of Cancer Biology in 2004. From 1998-2013, she served as the Director of the Ph.D.-granting Immunology Graduate Program. In 2004, she was appointed Associate Director for Basic Science Research of the Holden Comprehensive Cancer Center. Dr.

Bishop served as both an Associate and Section Editor of The Journal of Immunology, and has been a member of the Editorial board of The Journal of Leukocyte Biology since 2006. She served on the Cell Biology and Signal Transduction grant review panel of the National Science Foundation, the Microbiology & Immunology review panel of the American Heart Association, and the NIH Experimental Immunology study section. She completed a 2-year term of service as Chair of the NIH Tumors, Tolerance and Transplantation study section, and is a current member of the NCI-Frederick Scientific Advisory Committee. In 2003 she received the University of Iowa Graduate Mentoring Award, in 2009 was awarded the Iowa Technology Association's "Woman of Innovation" award for academic research innovation and leadership, and in 2014 was the first recipient of The University of Oklahoma Juneann Murphy Distinguished Women in Science Lectureship. Dr. Bishop served as President of the American Association of Immunologists 2012-2013, and is the Director of the University of Iowa Center for Immunology & Immune-Based Diseases.
