

Jill Suttles, Ph.D., has been a member of the SLB for more than 20 years and has served the society in a variety of roles, including as an annual meeting chair, member of the SLB Council, and as President of the SLB for the 2011-2013 term. She also served the Society as a board member and associate editor for the Journal of Leukocyte Biology. Dr. Suttles earned her bachelors of science degree in biology at the University of Oregon in Eugene and a doctorate in biology from Brandeis University in Waltham, MA. She completed a post-doctoral fellowship at Wake Forest University Medical Center in Winston-Salem, NC. Following her postdoctoral years she served as a faculty member and Deputy Chair of the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology at East Tennessee State University. In 1999 she joined the faculty of the Department of Microbiology and Immunology at the University of Louisville School of Medicine. Suttles enjoyed a productive career as a researcher, focusing most of her efforts on macrophage biology. In 2010-11, she was a fellow in the national Executive

Leadership in Academic Medicine (ELAM) Program. Her administrative service at U of L included acting as Interim Chair of the Department of Microbiology and Immunology and as Vice Dean for Faculty Affairs and Advancement. Suttles retired from U of L in January of this year and holds the tile of Professor Emeritus. She remains dedicated to the field of leukocyte biology, but now spends much of her time gardening, farming, and enjoying music and art.
